#### Past Perfect Continuous When do you use it again?

## An unfinished action before an other action B1

- I had been watching TV when he got home.
- He hadn't been cleaning when you got home.

## How long till a certain moment in the past B1

- I had been waiting for 3 hours when the arrived.
- He hadn't been studying for 5 minutes <u>before he took a</u> <u>break</u>.

## Action in the past with past result B1

- A: Why were you so tired?
- B: I had been working all day.
- The grass was wet because it had been raining.

#### Past perfect vs Past perfect cont Result vs Duration B2

- I had already cleaned the house before he got home. (focus on the result)
- I'd been cleaning for 5 hours before he got home. (focus on the time)

# Past perfect vs Past perfect cont How many vs How long B2

- I'd written <u>5 reports</u> before I went to lunch. (How many)
- I'd been writing reports <u>all</u> morning before joining the meeting. (How long)

#### Past perfect vs Past perfect cont State vs Action B2

- We had known each other for 3 years before we became friends.(state)
- They had been working together for 2 months, when Sam quit.(action)
