Past continuous

For the past

Long action interupted by a short A2

- I was walking on the street when I saw her.
- I wasn't taking a shower when you called me.
- Were you working in a bank when you met her?

2 Long actions at the same time A2

- I was watching the news while my husband was cooking.
- They weren't making noise while I was trying to study.
- Were you studying while I was cleaning?

An action starting before a certain time in the past A2

- We were having dinner at 8.
- I wasn't reading a book yesterday evening.
- Were you having breakfast at 9.30?

Annoying repeated action in the past C1

- She was <u>always</u> arriving late.
- She was <u>never</u> paying attention.
- Were they <u>always</u> making noise?

Repeated action in the past/Past habbit C1

- We were studying <u>every day</u>.
- She wasn't <u>always</u> practicing.
- Was he constantly partying?

Past continuous

For the future

2nd conditional C1

- You could join if I were driving.
- If it wasn't raining, we would go to the park.
- If you weren't working on Saturday, would you come to the party?

Mixed conditional C1+

- If you were driving, we could have gone with you.
- If it wasn't raining, we could have gone to the park.
- Would you have helped If you weren't working?
